Dr. Joshua Van Lieu is a historian of early modern and modern East Asian politics, thought, and critical international relations. He received his doctoral degree from the University of Washington in the histories of Chosŏn Korea and Late Imperial China. He has published on nineteenth-century Qing-Choson tribute politics, the historiography of reform movements in late Chosŏn Korea, the roles of state Guanti cults in narratives of Choson state legitimacy, and on critical approaches to historical international relations. Some of his current projects include an examination of precolonial historiographies of Chosŏn factionalism and the transformation of Qing-Choson tributary practice in the context of the global modern of the long nineteenth century. Dr. Van Lieu is currently the associate editor of *Acta Koreana* and an associate professor of history at Keimyung University in South Korea.
